Each Year, I have reported to you the status of our financial condition. Since this is my final report, I want to first thank you for your commitment and generosity for the last 19 years that I have served you. Whenever I have asked, you have come to the forefront and with generosity.

1. When I asked for resources to remodel and add to the Parish Hall, you responded positively.
2. When, I asked for a new rectory, many jumped in to help me find a new home.
3. When, I asked for a new church in Seaside, money and support were provided to remove the old rectory and to complete construction of our beautiful church.
4. Over the years, when I asked for increased offertory revenues, you again responded with increased generosity. This effort needs to continue to make our parish a place where we can glorify God and sanctify souls.
